SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, this is what the Chair is going to do because we are giving this much too much time. The DeCamp amendment has already been declared germane not to the Hoagland amendment but germane to the bill. That is where the issue is going to stop and I would like to have those who are involved get together and then meet with the Speaker by tomorrow so we see where we are on this issue. We cannot in fairness take any more time. So the DeCamp amendment is before us.

If there is, fine, then they know where they are. If there isn't, I won't offer it again.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp, in fairness to the Legislature, I don't think we can pose an amendment as voluminous as this at this time and so with the prerogative that I guess the Chair has this issue stops now. We have gone way overboard and I am sorry. There is nothing else we can do. I suggest that those who are interested in this issue get together as many people have during this session. For what purpose do you arise, Senator Venditte?

SENATOR VENDITTE: Just a point of clarification, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Go ahead.

SENATOR VENDITTE: Mr. Speaker, I think the issue is rather clear. I think rather than you having to take additional time in your office as to whether or not this should be back on the agenda tomorrow or some other time, I cannot support the amendment. I will not support the amendment. If it means killing the bill, it means killing the bill. I don't want to come back again tomorrow and take up the same issue again tomorrow, Mr. Speaker. Yes, I am unyielding on that particular amendment.

SENATOR VENDITTE: Why wait until tomorrow, Mr. Speaker. We can vote on it today.
