SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker, frankly I lost count on people changing back and forth.

CLERK: Senator Reutzel voting no. Senator Lamb still voting no. Senator Cope voting aye. Senator Cullan changing from no to yes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Have you all voted?

SENATOR KOCH: Start the roll call, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Poll call vote. Call the roll.

CLERK: Roll call vote taken. (See pages 2045 and 2046, Legislative Journal.) 20 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp moves to amend the bill and his amendments are on page 1918 of the Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Call is raised.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, would the Pages pass out the information. You remember the controversy at the last stage of this bill. It had to do with the financing mechanism. I told you I had an amendment to change it. I told you it would dramatically alter the cost of collection. I now offer the amendment I promised. I urge its adoption. The Pages are passing out information that shows you the cost cut down to a fraction of what it was, as I suggested to you. I offer the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is there any further discussion on the DeCamp amendment? Senator Merz, do you wish to talk on the DeCamp amendment? Your light is on.

SENATOR MERZ: Question. Let's vote.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? Okay, shall debate cease? Have you all voted? The motion is to cease debate. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 8 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Debate ceases. Senator DeCamp, do you want to close on your amendment?
