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that has ever been provided in the history of war and indeed he did. If you got your arm blown off, by golly, they tried to get a helicopter in to med evac you out. Unfortunately, the real wounds of the Vietnam Veteran were not of the body, they were of the mind and they are still going on today very severely, very seriously, for so many veterans and that is maybe the thing that I would hope this country would devote more attention to resolving. I urge you to adopt the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, just a word and that would be that I think that the attitude of the country was entirely different toward the Vietnamese War than any other war. Ordinarily before that, we have gone in to win and I don't know what we were doing over there but it wasn't to win, and when the fellows came home, as Senator DeCamp has indicated, there was no hoopla, no ticker tape parade. In fact, I think we vented some of our anger at the war toward some of the people who were actually in the war and, of course, this is wrong. We have, one of our staff on the Judiciary, Mr. John Goc who was in Vietnam and who has not been one that came home with an upset mind or confused, a very capable young man, made a good example of the veterans. I strongly support this resolution.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Wagner.

SENATOR WAGNER: Mr. President, Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I chose to put my name on this resolution because I have a son who was in the Vietnam war and along with that many friends. I think these are veterans that very well need to be recognized. I think the resolution does just that.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Members of the Legislature, I think this resolution is something that is not designed to justify the Vietnam War or even to deal with the war itself. Throughout history young men have been forced to fight in wars that they did not understand. They had no choice in the matter. So when people are compelled to do these things, there are different alternatives open. A person can leave the country. A person can stand his ground and risk going to the penitentiary suffering ostracism and the other things that a society heaps on those who will not fight in a war that he does not understand or does not agree with or he can succumb
