would be done, if 585 and 594 and 591 are amended to the extent that they are going to be and we take each one up as they come up and handle them, then the membership will know the total dollar amount of money that is committed in those bills and presumably no further amendments would be made or we would assume that none could be made. Then we could proceed to read with a motion that repealing the one about holding up A bills, proceed to read those A bills that you have listed and the membership would be working then with the knowledge of what the total appropriations are going to be. If we could get to the end of that list today I think everything would be very well finalized. I don't have any great objection I guess if 585 follows 594 but that is as long as I think we ought to wait to be consistent with the motion that we have all ready adopted that the absence of a member would not hold up a bill to take back to Select File but I don't think we should hold it longer than that.

SPEAKER MARVEL: How many other amendments are there on 595? Or 585, sorry.

CLERK: I have three, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, Senator Keyes, repeat your request. Do you have a specific amendment here to 585 that has to do with a million dollars to...

SENATOR KEYES: The gasohol program.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes.

SENATOR KEYES: I would follow very diligently what Senator Warner has suggested. I believe that would be fair and if everything is not right at that time we will go up with it anyhow.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay then, Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Would you want to take up the other two amendments?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes, sir, that is what I propose to do and then we will proceed. What other amendments do you have to 585?

CLERK: Mr. President, the second is offered by Senator Wesely. Senator Wesely moves to return LB 585 to Select
