SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President, members of the body, I rise to support my good friend, Senator Keyes' amendment. I think it is time we look at the gasohol program. I think it is time that we start doing something about it. This million dollars would provide, the way I understand it, would provide two grants for two plants and, therefore, we could do a little more experimenting with it. I know of several communities that would be real happy to go ahead with it if they could get a half a million dollar grant aplece. With the shortage of fossil fuels I feel that we need to develop other sources of energy and I believe that this would be the right step in the right direction. I urge you to support this amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, again I would rise to oppose the amendment. Number one, if you wish to stay within the 7% or less, the only way a million could be added is to take a million out somewhere else and I doubt that that can be found but more importantly as I understand LB 424 that was passed last session and one of the reasons the committee did not put any money in to afford this program was that, at least of the proposals that were presented it was at least questionable if not more so that anything could be distributed under the enabling legislation even if you put the money in.
