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with gasohol. Certainly the Legislature is not neglecting the interest of gasohol with that major legislation pending, and then finally, it seems to me that in all probability little would be done in all likelihood by this calendar year in any event should you put the money in and it would seem more appropriate that those various alternatives that have been discussed for projects were put into shape better than they are now so that the Legislature as a whole could really know what was occurring and it would seem to me it would be premature to adopt the amendment offered by Senator Keyes and I hope you would turn it down for a variety of reasons.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, dear colleagues, I call for the question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? Okay. All those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye, opposed no. The motion is to cease debate. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 5 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried. Debate ceases. The Chair recognizes Senator Keyes to close on his amendment.

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. Speaker, in closing on this, I am going to ask my good friend, Senator Kahle, to say something but I do have this to say to you if you will stop and listen. I believe we are under... Are we under Call? Are Senators supposed to be in their seat or congregating in the middle of the Chamber?

SPEAKER MARVEL: No, we are not under Call.

SENATOR KEYES: Out of my ten minutes I don't want you to keep count right now but I would like to find out. I believe the Senators are going to gradually...(interruption.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Well, Senator Keyes, technically we always get into an argument on this. When we are under item #6, Final Reading, states that we are supposed to be under Call. Do you want a Call of the House or what?

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, I believe we are under Call. Well if we are under Call there is no need to having that. Just have them sit down in their seat for a while.

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
