CLERK: 27 ayes, 8 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill has been returned. Now, Senator DeCamp, do you want to move the adoption?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Regrettably but I do so.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the DeCamp amendment to LB 585. All in favor of the adoption of that motion vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 12 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The amendment is adopted. The motion is to return the bill to E & R for engrossment. All in favor of returning 585 to E & R for engrossment vote aye, opposed no. Record the vote. Senator Warner, do you have an announcement? I'm sorry, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 11 nays on the motion to readvance, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The amendment is adopted. Senator Warner, before we recess do you have a...?

SENATOR WARNER: Two things, Mr. President, if as I understood when these bills were worked they could be sent, could be processed so that they can be reported in yet today as properly engrossed and they can be printed and be on our desks tomorrow and read Friday and we do know now or we can have on your desks when we come back after recess where the financial status is, and with that understanding, Mr. President, it would seem reasonable to either by motion to rescind the previous motion of holding up A bills and allow A bills to be read according to the agenda because the body will be in the possession of the knowledge of wherever we are at on a financial basis and then we can proceed orderly.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want to make the motion?

SENATOR WARNER: I would so move, Mr. President, that the balance of the A bills on today's agenda to be read after lunch and we will have on your desk the financial status including all A bills as we now stand.
