SPEAKER MARVEL: One.

SENATOR STONEY: Well nineteen and six is twenty five. Could I ask for a Call of the House please?

SPEAKER MARVEL: A Call of the House has been requested. Clear the board, please. The question is, shall the House go under Call. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 11 ayes, 4 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please take their seats. Record your presence. Senator Warner, would you please record your presence? Senator Kahle, Senator Wagner, Senator Newell, Senator Frank Lewis, Senator Chambers, Senator Labedz. Senator Stoney, everybody is accounted for except Senator Kahle. Pardon?

SENATOR STONEY: Senator Schmit?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Schmit just left and asked to be excused on the way out.

SENATOR STONEY: Let's read the roll.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Call the roll.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote found on page 2139 of the Legislative Journal.) 19 ayes, 28 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. I think we have two more amendments and I think we will just try to hold the Call if we can. Read the next amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Dworak moves to amend: (Read Dworak amendment found on page 2139 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President and colleagues, and this is not a harassing amendment.
