will not be taxed. Returnable glass bottles and aluminum and the reason behind that, quite frankly, is that it encourages recycling which is what the intent of the bill is, is to encourage redemption and recycling centers. It also encourages returnable bottles and I think that if this, in fact, is what we would like to encourage then we shouldn't penalize them with a tax. The amendment is offered in good faith. I talked to John about it. I told John I was going to offer it and my intentions for offering it and I think the amendment makes a lot of sense.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the Dworak amendment to LB 120. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 24 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. The amendment is not adopted. What is the next amendment?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Johnson moves to amend LB 120 by striking "newspapers" from line 18, page 8.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Johnson.

SENATOR JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, my amendment is almost identical to what Senator Stoney's amendment was and since his amendment was defeated I do ask unanimous consent that it be withdrawn.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Hearing no objection, so ordered.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, as Moses once said, let my puppy go. I move it be advanced.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the advancement of LB 120 to E & R for engrossment. A machine vote has been requested. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 19 nays on the motion to readvance, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion carries. The bill is advanced. Senator Koch, do you want to take up 158? Yes.
