SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: (Record vote was taken which may be found on Page 2154 of the Legislative Journal.) 43 ayes, 1 nay, 5 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is declared passed with the emergency clause attached. The Clerk will now read 505A.

CLERK: (Read title to LB 505A.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: (Record vote was taken which may be found on Page 2155 of the Legislative Journal.) 42 ayes, 1 nay, 6 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is declared passed. Now we will go back to LB 444.

CLERK: (Read title to LB 444.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass with emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: (Record vote was taken which may be found on Page 2156 of the Legislative Journal.) 46 ayes, 0 nays and 3 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is declared passed with the emergency clause attached.
