SPEAKER MARVEL: The second vote, not the first vote.

SENATOR SIMON: Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Kremer, Senator Cullan is excused and Senator Lewis is the only one who isn't here. Do you want to proceed with the roll call? Senator Kelly's button is not working and he is recorded as being present. Clerk, call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote was taken which may be found on Page 2169 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: All legislators are still supposed to be in their seats. We're still under Call.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion fails. The Call is raised. Ready to go to Select File?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. We're on Select File. The bill is LB 158.

CLERK: Mr. President, the body considered LB 158 yesterday. At that time the E & R amendments were adopted. Senator Beutler now has pending a motion, Mr. President, and that motion is found on Page 2140 of the Legislative Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I wish to withdraw the motion. I'm not altogether convinced that I'm doing the right thing in this case, but I want to give the financial community in the state an opportunity to make judicious use of this instrument. I intend to monitor the projects that are constructed through the use of tax increment financing and I intend to be sure that I am satisfied in my own mind that the process is not being abused, and I have Senator Koch's word that he will follow it also and that he will also insist on strict compliance with the law. So with that I wish to withdraw the motion.
