

SENATOR KEYES: In other words, the commission is going to go ahead once more without anybody from Sarpy, without anybody from our district, the commission is going to, we are going to let them appoint somebody to serve on this other board without any representation or the correct representation from the eastern district, whatever it is called. What we are doing my friends is perpetuating a policy that has been on the State of Nebraska, been on the Omaha, Douglas, Washington Counties, Sarpy County for quite some time has been keeping us from doing it and I and Senator Kremer have been talking about this text several times and it always comes out that we will do it next year. Some day, I would like to get somebody who actually lives in our district, not just farms there but actually lives there to be a part of that commission. Thank you.

SENATOR KREMER: Senator Keys, the problem that you are addressing is involved in LB 423, I believe, it is on General File and will come up next session, and you can take care of it there.

SENATOR KEYES: For three years I have been hoping so Kremer.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Dworak, do you wish to be recognized.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, colleagues, I support Senator Warner's amendment. I think that it is a good solution to a problem that we had here a week or so ago. We still have legislative oversight which was the major concern of some people. We still have various people that are interested in water representend on this advisory committee. We have taken the advisory group out of the governor's office and we have no objection to the Natural Resource Commission making the appointment from the names submitted to them by the Exec Board of the Legislature. I think that we have all bases covered and I would urge everyone to support Senator Warner's amendment. I would like to call the question.
