SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried. Debate ceases. Chair recognizes Senator Warner to close on his motion to 595.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move adoption of the amendment. I think that it has been adequately explained.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the Warner amendment to LB 595. Senator Keyes, your light is on. Do you wish to speak? I'm sorry, he is closing. All those in favor of the motion vote aye, those opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, no nays on the adoption of Senator Warner's amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried. Amendment is adopted. Before we go to the next amendment it is my pleasure to introduce in the south balcony from Senator Beutler's district, 75 third grade students from Randolph School Lincoln, Nebraska. Pam Rathe is the teacher. Will you hold up your hands and show us where you are. We welcome you. The next amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment is offered by Senator Kremer and Senator Dworak.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Chair recognizes Senator Kremer for amendments to LB 595.

SENATOR KREMER: Again Mr. Chairman and members of the legislature, you have the proposed amendments on your desk. I believe that they are all passed out. Now I will be glad to go through the amendments and address each one if you would like. I would like to say this. The concerns that some of us had, especially on page 8 of LB 595 have been taken care of. There was some language there that some of us felt rather strongly, that was not clear enough and Senator Dworak myself and others involved in the amendment to 595 have spend with our staff a great deal of time. We feel that now we have come up with a clarification of language, that was of concern, that makes the bill acceptable to all of us that were involved in this work, so I am going to move that we adopt the amendment without further explanation. Only that it clarifies the language, there are some technical changes there that needed to be made and I am satisfied with it now. I would like to give the rest of time to Senator Dworak if there are any comments that he would like to make on this amendment at this time.
