SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...to allow enough time to pass for the Governor to act. Then we could come back and do whatever we wanted to do.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Well, the day that we would use up tomorrow will be saved until next week, so that it's there. If we use it up tomorrow it isn't going to be there next week, and I think we're ahead with that in mind, but I assure you that with all the backing I have I'm going to try to see that E & R is prepared and that our business with the Governor will be handled satisfactorily, at least processed, so that we won't have to worry about that schedule.
