SENATOR MURPHY: After that any subsequent expansion will come under the lid? Ho, ho, ho!

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion before the House is the Koch amendment to LB 479. Senator Koch, do you wish to close?

SENATOR KOCH: I have no closing, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the Koch amendment to LB 479. Have you all voted? This is the last bill today. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record. Have you all voted? We have 24 votes now. Record. Go ahead.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 9 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the amendment is adopted. Are there any other amendments to the bill?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Carsten, do you want to...whose bill is this? Senator DeCamp's. Senator Duis, for what purpose do you arise? Go ahead, Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, I move LB 479 be advanced as amended.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Keyes. The motion is on advancement of the bill.

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, Mr. Speaker, if we could get just a little attention in the Legislature, I would like to give just a few comments on this bill because if this bill was an umbrella and you got out in a small rain you would drown, or if you got out in the sun on a cloudy day, you would get sunstroke. I want to read you just a little bit about this, what we have done. Not what Senator Koch has just done
