SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, the reason we want to return this, our legal counsel has taken this up with the Attorney General's office, and they raised a question as to some of the wording. It's not substantive, but we wanted to change it before it was too late so that's the reason why we're bringing it back.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion on the motion to return LB 378? If not, all those in favor of returning LB 378 signify by voting aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? The motion is the return of LB 378. Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. LB 378 is returned. The Chair recognizes Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, I move for the adoption of the amendment. We're putting it into general language rather than specific so that the courts do have the latitude that the Attorney Generals think they need. I move for the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: All right. Motion to adopt the Nichol amendment to LB 378. Any discussion? The question then is, the adoption of the Nichol amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay on the adoption of Senator Nichol's amendment.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The amendment is adopted. Senator Nichol, do you want to just move it on?

SENATOR NICHOL: Yes, I move for the advancement of LB 378.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to advance LB 378 to E & R for Engrossment. Any discussion? All those in favor signify by saying aye. Opposed nay. LB 378 is advanced to E & R for Engrossment. The next bill, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Nichol...well first of all, Senator Nichol moves to suspend all pertinent rules to allow the following amendment to LB 363A.
