PRESIDENT: Senator Nichol, do you have anything further on the motion to suspend the rules?

SENATOR NICHOL: Suspend the rules.

PRESIDENT: The motion before the House then is the suspension of the rules in order that LB 363A may be utilized in the fashion mentioned by Senator Nichol to put 597 into it. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. This will require thirty votes. Have you all voted? This is a motion to suspend the rules. Have you all voted? Well, Senator Nichol, I said this before, we should never have raised the Call.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman....

PRESIDENT: So would you like to make the motion to bring everybody back so we can vote on this?

SENATOR NICHOL: I think we have enough members on the floor, if they would....

PRESIDENT: We've got twenty.

SENATOR NICHOL: I move for a Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: The motion is Call of the House. Clear the board. All those in favor of a Call of the House vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 1 nay to go under Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The House is under Call. All members will return to their desks. The Sergeant at Arms will bring in all members of the Legislature. All members of the Legislature will record your presence. The House is under Call. Have you all registered your presence?

CLERK: Senator Carsten....

PRESIDENT: Senator Carsten...

CLERK:voting aye.

PRESIDENT: ...voting aye. Senator Merz wants to vote.

CLERK: Senator Merz voting aye.

PRESIDENT: All right, and Senator Chambers voting aye. Record the vote.
