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this point and one that would allow some progress to be made in the gasohol area and as a practical matter will have no adverse effect on either the conservation fund or the resource development fund in the long run. Thank you.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Murphy, did you wish to speak to this?

SENATOR MURPHY: Well just on a personal point, Mr. Chairman. I have a lost a five eighths double end box wrench from my tool set and I wondered if Emory Burnett would kind of watch for it while he is working on the computer.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Marsh, did you wish to speak to this subject?

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. Presiding Officer and members of the Legislature, I certainly do wish to speak on this issue. Senator Schmit had a bill up to strike funds this year which was in the area last year of Senator Bereuter's bill. We did indefinitely postpone Senator Schmit's bill and I take exception at this time of mandating where these funds would come from and what would be cut. In other words, it is just one more try again. It solves his purpose of finding those funds but I certainly rise to oppose it and I ask your support not to bring this back.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Kahle.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. President, members of the body, I am rather disappointed that we are winding up our last days in the Legislature with a broken down computer which seems that is going to louse up the whole legislative process and to think that just a year ago when we were closing down, we were going to put the total county reappraisal on one of those machines and had a terrific battle in this particular chamber, so I want to get my shot in on that, but I am not in favor of what Senator Schmit is trying to do. I am certainly in favor of money being put in by the State of Nebraska to promote the building of alcohol plants but I think this is a piddly amount. It isn't going to amount to anything and you are taking it from a department that all ready was allotted this money and I don't think they should be deprived of what they are trying to do at the cost of the alcohol program, not for \$300,000 anyhow. I don't know whether the Schmit-Bereuter campaign is over yet or not but I do not go along
