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with this procedure and I would hope...I guess the Speaker is out of the room at the moment, that I would suggest that perhaps we should adjourn until the computer is fixed. Thank you.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President and colleagues, I am somewhat amazed at Senator Warner's change in position on this. I personally think, as Senator Marsh said, that we fought the battle on the small watershed fund and I think it is a good fund. I think it is sensible. I am a little bit appalled at \$300,000 now suddenly isn't going to make any difference in this fund one way or the other. That totally stuns me. I believe that the criteria at this point for water has been established. It is obviously one of Nebraska's number one problems. It is one of the problems we are going to have to face now and in the future and I think to raid this fund would be extreme bad policy. Now if gasohol should go in with other priorities but to come in and single out this one from all areas as sensitive as water, to me is a terrible mistake. I think that we need to take a look at gasohol. I think Senator Schmit keeps telling us that the Nebraska Gasohol Commission and its sterling leadership in the nation has done so much for this state but the four federal grants that were granted, not a one of them was awarded in the State of Nebraska. Now I am not so sure that this commission is doing all that it has been touted as doing. I am very much opposed to this amendment. I think water affects all the people in the State of Nebraska and I just wonder if we would go on all out production on gasohol as Senator Schmit would like and the price of corn would go to four or five dollars a bushel, how happy cattle feeders would be about that, feeding four or five dollar a bushel corn. I think this is a bad last minute desperation attempt to raid this watershed fund. I think the timing is poor and I think it is a bad idea. I personally am not going to support this amendment and I think some other people better take a very strong look at this when we start putting water in secondary priority next to an unproven and untried idea.

SENATOR NICHOL: We still have eight lights on on this matter. The Chair recognizes Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President, I move that we cease debate.
