Senator Schmit, we will make sure that all of them are in here before we...I want to make sure that everybody is out of the rotunda because as I walked through the rotunda I saw some members. We will wait until the Sergeant at Arms returns and then we will get a report. Senator Venditte is supposed to be here. Senator Johnson is here. Senator Lamb is here. He is over here. Senator Venditte is the only one. Senator Schmit, do you wish to proceed then with a roll call vote or...?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Yes, Mr. President, would you have a roll call, please?

PRESIDENT: Do you want to wait for Senator Venditte to get here or do you want to proceed?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Is he in the building, Mr. President?

PRESIDENT: I assume that he is. He has not been excused.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Would you try to find him then, please?

PRESIDENT: All right, we will wait for Senator Venditte to be in the Chamber. He should be here because the House is under Call unless he has been excused. While we are waiting for Senator Venditte the Chair would introduce from Senator Stoney's district, the first of some four groups of seventy-five eighth graders and four teachers from Mary Our Queen Elementary School in Omaha, Mary Kay Esser, teacher, up here in the North balcony. Would they
