with the provision that Senator Schmit has in the amendment, that restricts the use of those funds unless approved by the Governor assuring compliance with 424 and I am not at all sure that anybody will be able to comply with it but if they can, it seems to me that this is not as unreasonable as it perhaps sounds on the surface and on that basis I would suggest that it is not inappropriate to adopt this amendment.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President, I spoke on this matter before. I think it is pretty well known how I feel about it but I would like to point out for the members of this body, one simple fact. Either you are for private industry, you are for the capitalistic system which is what the United States is made of or you are not. I would suggest to the members of this body that want to put this money in this gasohol development that they simply put their own private funds in that development. If they think these plants are so economically feasible and if they think they are so great, then why don't they construct one? But please don't take my tax dollars and do it and don't take the tax dollars of the remainder of the taxpayers of the State of Nebraska to do it. It is very obvious that, to me at least, that if it was so feasible and if it was so great, they would be being built right now. The forty nine members of this body wouldn't have to be making that decision. We would not have to be putting the funds into it. So the basic decision that you have to make right now is whether or not you want to spend those taxpayers dollars for something that obviously private industry isn't ready for. I would like to yield the remainder of this time back to Senator Marsh.
