pass today what is on the Agenda, which includes the rule suspension. We have to pass, in other words, what is on Final Reading today. Pat, will you follow this so that if you want to add something to it you can? We have to pass Enrollment and Review Final tomorrow. We have to pass Select File on Wednesday. If we do this, and if we get the bills passed by Wednesday noon, the Governor has agreed and Senator...or Lt. Governor Luedtke was there, the Governor has agreed that if we can get the bills on Final Reading to end by noon Wednesday and allow a reasonable time Wednesday afternoon we can come back late Wednesday afternoon and he will have the bills to us that he would veto so that we have time Wednesday afternoon to override whatever, or process the vetos, and we then can adjourn. So let me repeat. If we follow the schedule today and take up Final Reading as it is on your worksheet, if we follow the schedule tomorrow and take up Enrollment and Review that's on your worksheet, and if we follow the schedule on Wednesday and take up Select File that is on your worksheet, and get the bills to the Governor by noon on Wednesday and give him several hours, in other words, late Wednesday afternoon to process the bills and send any of them back that he doesn't agree with, we can act on those late Wednesday afternoon and be out of here. Now, Mr. Clerk, does that follow the schedule? Mr. Lt. Governor, is that the agreement that we...?

PRESIDENT: That is correct.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. Now that's the schedule. If we can follow this schedule for the rest of today, tomorrow and the next day, then we can adjourn sine die, and be fair to everybody including him, on Wednesday, late Wednesday afternoon or early Wednesday evening.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Kelly. I think he had a question. Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Yes, Mr. President, I have a question of Senator Marvel. Senator Marvel, I think this is half-way a serious question. You consistently said that we had to pass these bills on the schedule in order to get out of here. Does that mean that you are referring that we process these bills rather than pass them?

SPEAKER MARVEL: So half-way serious, I will be half-way serious and say in effect that all we have to do is pass the bills. You can vote any way you want to, Senator Kelly.
