SENATOR DWORAK: (mike not activated)

SPEAKER MARVEL: We are talking about the difference between General File and rule changes and we have ruled that there is a difference and this does need 25 votes. First of all shall the House go under Call. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 2 nays to go under Call.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion carries, the House is under Call. All legislators please take your seats. Record your presence. Unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Now that we are all present the Clerk is authorized to take call in votes.

CLERK: Senator Murphy voting aye, changing from no to yes. Senator Kennedy changing from no to yes. Senator Goodrich voting aye. Senator Cope changing from yes to no.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Announce the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, motion carried and the Koch amendment to rule change number two is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Nichol now moves to amend by striking "not more than four" and insert "at least six".

SPEAKER MARVEL: Chair recognizes Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, all this bill does is say that we will work six days a week instead of four. For those of us who live a long ways it is very much more practical for us to stay here six days a week and work than it is to run home one day and back the next. So, it is impossible for us to function properly under the proposed rule change. I know that nobody will vote for this but a few of us who live in the west end. I'd like to give it a try.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Lamb, do you wish to speak to the Nichol amendment?
