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and ~~me~~ attorneys in this Legislature with the passing of time. Senator Dworak, poor Senator Dworak. He has indicated that his anatomical structure is showing wear and tear and he is becoming quite irritable. Well, Senator, I guess I might just encourage you next year to include January, February and March in your winter vacation plans. Maybe secondly, Senator, you ought to quit playing racketball over the noon hour. That might help. I guess that it is rather interesting because additional comments that were made here this afternoon said that it is going to afford each and every one of us more time with our constituents back home. Ladies and gentlemen, if someone wants to contact me, and they do almost every single day, they know where to get me. I am home every afternoon at 5:30 or 6:00. Everyone of us in here, Senator Fowler, everyone of us in here including members of the Lancaster delegation can be home within 45 minutes. You know to sort of say that this will afford us more time with our constituents, you know I think is kind of an erroneous statement on the part of those who are just simply supporting this particular amendment. I think that anytime anyone of our constituents want us back home we will be there within one hour. I guess we ought to be somewhat realistic with this particular issue to all of us, at least those people who are supporting it, and if you want an extra day to go back to your firms to work in your law practice, if you want an extra day to go back home and work in your own independent business, whatever that is, then let's bring that issue out. If it is becoming a hardship for those of you who have come down here recently, well maybe that should be brought out too. I don't think that we are being honest with one another and I think that we are wasting a great deal of time here debating this very issue. With that, Mr. Speaker, I'll call the question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Wagner.

SENATOR WAGNER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I rise too to oppose this. It...to me it will create a great deal of difficulty going back and forth. We have the energy situation that somebody has already mentioned. For me, I go home each weekend, the amount of miles I drive is going to very definitely increase. But I think probably one of the biggest things that I feel here is the public image that this is going to create. Because people are going to be looking at us going to a four day week and I think maybe already the image of the legislature may not be the greatest and for that respect I would oppose that. I would almost think that maybe the state employees ought to be the next ones up to ask for a four day weekend. With these thoughts in mind, I do oppose this. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.
