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we do not do our own personal sifting and unless we have got a rule that will prohibit us from introducing too many bills we are not going to get that bill introduction down. I'm fully aware that the amendment that has been submitted does give some reduction. But I believe that my original proposal will help us a tremendous amount in our work load and the time that we can devote to each and every bill that would come before us. I'm full aware that there are areas that has more demands upon that district perhaps than others. But, I also believe that there are not more than ten crucial problems in any one legislative district in the State of Nebraska every two years. In addition to that the committees that will be restrained from more than ten bills also will have to act under that same guidance and restriction. In my opinion, we as committees members have been lax in accepting the introduction of bills that we could very well have done without. It is in that light that I hope that the amendment is not accepted and that the original introduction as I have proposed it to the Rules Committee would be accepted. I have had comments saying that it would be well if the Legislature didn't meet at all. Or even met every other year. It was also my understanding when we voted to go to annual sessions that the 90 day session would be for the introduction of bills generally and that the 90 day session would be limited to new introductions only on appropriation measures. I believe that it was on that concept that the annual sessions were approved. With that also added to what I have already said I believe that we can help ourselves as well as to help the State of Nebraska to keep this introduction of bills to a very minimal amount and do justice to each one that is then introduced. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Newell, your light is on. Do you wish to be recognized on this? We are speaking to the committee amendment which is the last paragraph on the first page. That is the Chair's understanding. Okay. Senator Nichol, do you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR NICHOL: Yes, Mr. Chairman and members of the committee. I really think that we should have a look at this before we go on it because of the restriction on the various committees. Just for fun I made a list on February 5th worksheet as to how many bills each committee had. If you are interested the Ag Committee had 27, Banking 56, Business and Labor 16, Judiciary 59, and so on down the list. Public Works 53, Urban Affairs 19. Now this doesn't seem to be fair to be limiting each committee to ten bills when there is this much variance between...among committees. Now I would think, Mr. Chairman and members of this body, that we should make some difference between
