in what the committee is doing? You bet and I'm very interested in all of those committees and all of their bills, but furthermore I am interested in where did the bills come from? Did they come from the people on the street or did they come from the people out of your district or my district? Or did they come from the agencies in which the committee is supposed to write the rules and write the law for the people of the committees of which it is "supervising or paying attention to" or has the system flipped over to whereby the agencies truly, as an example the court system, truly call you, Mr. Chairman of the Judiciary Committee, and say you have got to enter this bill, that is all there is to it, we have got to have it. Now you and I know, Senator Nichol, that the last is the correct way this is and the Chairman of the committee and the committee members in their executive session will bitch and scream and holler about the fact of why didn't they bring that over to us earlier? The reason they didn't is that they can bring it to you any time you want to and this legislature jumps right through the hoop to pass that bill for the Department of Water Resources or for the Supreme Court or for the Ag Department or the Governor's office or whoever it may be and I believe that to be backwards. I think the limit on those committees are excellent and I think the limit on us individually is collective, or is correct from just one standpoint. As a member of the Legislature you would have ten slots. You will have to be discerning and you will have to be judgmental and make a choice of what questions in your district should be addressed. The Public Works Committee is going to have to make a choice of what is it they are going to work on. Roads, public power, water problems, but they are not going to be able to enter bills on all of them. They are going to have to make very substantial choices. The committee system that we have been protecting this afternoon by our mouths, here is a chance to protect it by your vote and make a committee really have some wallop with the agencies and have those agencies fighting to see which one of the bills is going to get out of the committee. Ha! Which one is going to get in? 56 bills a committee introduces and we have got a limit on bills? No, we haven't. But under Senator Carsten's leadership we will have and I support his proposal and I do not support the amendment by the Rules Committee.
