SPEAKER MARVEL: The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? Okay, I see five hands. The question before the House is shall debate cease. All those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Motion is to cease debate. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 6 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Debate is ceased. The Chair recognizes Senator Carsten. No, we are voting on the committee amendment, I'm sorry. Senator Fowler.

SENATOR FOWLER: The difference between the committee amendment and the Carsten amendment deals with the question of limitation on individual bills. Senator Carsten's original proposal was ten bills over a two year period. The committee amendment was to make that 16 in line with the numbers established in the Beutler rule change. So, if you vote for the committee amendment it will mean that an individual senator can introduce 16 bills over a two year period, if you oppose it it means 10 bills over a two year period.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of the committee amendment vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Senator Fowler, may I have...have you all voted? Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Could I have a Call of the House and a roll call vote?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the question is shall the House go under Call. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Will the Legislature please move rapidly. We have an announcement to make in a minute. Have you recorded your vote? We are under...Okay, record.

CLERK: 20 ayes, no nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All Legislators please take your seats, record your presence. Senator Haberman, record your presence please. Senator Goodrich, Senator Dworak, Senator Fitzgerald, Senator Stoney, Senator Simon, Senator Rumery. Do you want to proceed with the roll call, Senator Beutler? Okay, proceed with the roll call vote. Let's do this as rapidly as we can so that the Chair can recognize Senator Duis.

CLERK: Roll call vote. 16 ayes, 17 nays, 3 excused and not voting, 11 present and not voting. Vote appears on pages 2272-2273 of the Legislative Journal.
