PRESIDENT: Thank you, Senator Cullan. All right, the question before the house then is, the Cullan motion to bracket LB 42. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 25 nays to bracket the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. The bill will be read on Final Reading and the Clerk will proceed to read LB 42 on Final Reading.

CLERK: (Read LB 42 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: Just a moment, for what purpose do you arise, Senator Keyes?

SENATOR KEYES: Because of the controversy over this bill I would like it read so we can understand what is being said.

PRESIDENT: If you will listen real carefully you will be able to do that. Just be very attentive, Senator Keyes, and you will hear every word. Proceed to read just the way you were. That is fine. I can understand every word.

CLERK: (Continued to read LB 42 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions relating to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 42 pass with the emergency clause attached. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: (Read record vote found on pages 2278-2279 of the Legislative Journal.) 36 ayes, 12 nays.

PRESIDENT: LB 42 passes with the emergency clause attached. The Chair would ask that all members of the Legislature please try to stay at your desks. We have allowed quite a bit of leeway, the Speaker and I have this year as far as long bills but this was not particularly a long bill and we had all kind of groups meeting and really the sound was getting real loud from up here. So would you please try to stay as close to your desk. It just doesn't look good. Senator Lewis, for what purpose do you arise?
