Senator Kahle, would you please record your presence?
Senator Haberman, would you please record your presence?
Mr. Sergeant at Arms, Senator Schmit, Senator Goodrich.
All others are excused. Now the Board is open if anybody
who hasn't voted wishes to vote. The Board is open.
The Clerk record the vote then. The Clerk can accept
call in votes.

CLERK: Senator Fowler voting aye.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Goodrich, this is a Call of the
House on the advancement of LB 436.

CLERK: Senator Kennedy voting no. Senator Goodrich voting
aye.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators
please keep in their seats.

CLERK: Senator Carsten voting aye. Senator Lewis voting
aye. Senator Haberman was voting aye.

SENATOR REUTZEL: I move the Call be raised, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Call is raised. The Clerk will record
the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 17 nays on the motion to advance, Mr.
President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is
advanced. Now first of all as we prepare to adjourn for
this afternoon, does anybody have any bills they wish to
put on the Clerk's desk. Senator Lewis, is the Exec
Board meeting tomorrow to refer bills?

SENATOR LEWIS: Mr. Speaker, members, I told the Chairmen
yesterday that we will do two referrals in the next two
or three days. Tomorrow at 2:30 p.m. I am going to ask
the Board to approve the referrals so anybody that has
bills and wants them early on so we can do the printing
over the weekend let me encourage you to do that. Then
we will meet Monday at noon to take care of additional
referrals of bills introduced Friday morning. Tom just
reported to me that he has all the bills ready for
referral that are in today so, Mr. Speaker, if you'd have
time yet today to have additional introduction of bills
and those in the morning, why we can get those out and
we are not encouraging people to introduce bills, but if
