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substitute for a whole rule the eighteen sections are kind of integrated together. The ones yesterday were seven separate and distinct rule changes, and I think that perhaps since it is kind of an integrated package it would be easier rather than approve each section one by one to take the amendments up. So I would prefer...I think people have had a chance to read all the sections. They were presented yesterday section by section in discussion, and since they are tied together as they are, now if someone wants to move to delete language they can move that as an amendment. If someone wants to go back to original language they can move that, but people requested the time to look it over and I think they have had that time, and therefore I think that we can just take up any amendments or changes and then vote on the package after that. So I think we can take up the amendments. The Rule 3 section is so tied together that I think it could expedite things to take those up that way.

PRESIDENT: We will proceed then with it as an entire package and have it amended as a whole and so, Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman.

PRESIDENT: Yes, sir.

SENATOR NICHOL: Would it be possible for Senator Fowler or you to tell us which packet we are working from? I assume we are on the proposed revamp of Rule 3 and as we take up these amendments tell us the page so that we can follow it.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Fowler, will you tell them the page on this committee packet...

SENATOR NICHOL: Right, for each amendment so we will be looking at the right page.

PRESIDENT: ...so that we're all looking at the right page. Thank you, Senator Nichol. All right then we will take up the first amendment which was Senator Newell's, was it, or Senator...which one do you have?

CLERK: Mr. President, the first was offered by Senator Wesely.

PRESIDENT: Wesely, all right.

CLERK: His amendment is found in the Journal on page 144. It goes to section 14 of the package entitled Executive Sessions and Closed Meetings. Senator Wesely would amend that proposal by adding to subparagraph (a) the following language: "Members of the news media may report any action
