SENATOR NEWELL: Maybe it would be good not that the rule will pass but to bring everybody in so that they all know that they have a chance to talk about this and listen to their colleagues. So why don't we have a Call of the House?

PRESIDENT: All right, if you...Senator Kelly. Yes, Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, does the rule state that there has to be such that the question can carry before a Call of the House can be made?

PRESIDENT: Well, there have been occasions where it had no chance to carry and they still called the House to put people on record. So I think it is possible to want to make everybody vote, and I think you can do that. I don't think you can say that it has to be able to carry.

SENATOR KELLY: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: So, Senator Newell, do you still want a Call of the House?

SENATOR NEWELL: No, just record the vote.

PRESIDENT: All right, record the vote.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 20 nays on the adoption of the proposed changed, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails and the committee amendment is not adopted. Senator Fowler, are there any other amendments?

CLERK: Several.

PRESIDENT: All right, the next amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have an amendment offered by Senator Beutler. Senator Beutler would move to amend section 14 of the proposed revamp by in line 3 of subsection (a) strike "minutes" and insert "records".

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, this is a small change which was made in response to an objection yesterday I think by Senator Maresh, and a proper one. We did not intend that everybody write minutes of the meetings, only that what records exist be available,
