SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I rise also in opposition to the motion to recommit to committee and I think that Senator Haberman should approach this, if he disagrees with the bill simply by placing a kill motion on the bill and fight it that way. There is no reason to send the bill back to the committee. It has had an adequate hearing. Senator Chambers makes very few mistakes but he did make a mistake as to what this bill does. It does not establish a standard of need below which no citizen in the State of Nebraska would be allowed to fall. It just allows for the determination of that standard and that standard as I understand it would not necessarily be used for that purpose. I may or may not support this bill as I have told Senator Johnson. I did vote for it to come out of committee. I think that it is an issue that deserves discussion on the floor of the legislature, I'm going to listen to Senator Johnson and Senator Haberman and any point of view that may be discussed. I do have some concerns that we may be spending money for a study that is not necessary. But, I'll wait and listen to Senator Johnson and then make up my mind. But my advice to Senator Haberman is that if he desires to kill the bill to put a kill motion on it and not try a procedural mistake I believe of sending it back to committee. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Newell.
