We have agreed to take off certain Fridays and so my motion is that we recess until four o'clock, I'm sorry, recess until 1:30 p.m. and then come back and stay until four o'clock. Now if this...when we come back at 1:30 p.m., if we find that there aren't enough to meet, then I assume we have no choice but to adjourn but I think in the future that if Friday is becoming once again a time when people do not want to meet, in fairness to everybody who has issues that will be coming up toward the end of the session we'll simply have to eliminate Friday as a working day. So with that in mind my motion is that we recess until 1:30 p.m.
