SENATOR KEYES: Okay, then what basically really does it have a limit on?

SENATOR WARNER: The basis of it is that early on it permits the entire Legislature to have input to give guidance for the Appropriations Committee as to what total level appropriation that we recommend should be.

SENATOR KEYES: Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: First of all the motion was the unanimous consent motion to withdraw the bill found printed in the Journal on page 194 and I heard no objection so that is ordered. And the second motion is the amendment to LB 550 that Senator Warner discussed and so the motion is to adopt the Warner amendment to LB 550 as discussed. All those in favor of adopting the amendment vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to adopt Senator Warner's amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner, do you want to move the advancement of the bill as amended now.

SENATOR WARNER: I move the bill be advanced.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to advance LB 550 as amended. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion carried. The bill is advanced. While we are proceeding, we will pass out the agenda for Monday for you. Senator Fowler asked that we pass over LB 60 so it is so ordered. Senator DeCamp, do you want to pass over what is left of LB 69?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, I would love to take it up but it probably would be unfair to the independents, they haven't completed their advertising campaign on television yet, for me to go slipping old 69 across here today on a Friday afternoon with half of the members absent. It just wouldn't be fair to them so reluctantly I will pass it over.
