And when it comes along that those who are borrowing money at the rate of twelve, thirteen, fourteen, fifteen percent and has to compete with the price that is probably sixty or seventy percent of parity with all the rest of this products in the United States, it is wrong. All this amendment will do...all this resolution will do is ask that the Congress of the United States, the Department of Agriculture give to the farmers of this state what is rightfully theirs, that is ninety percent of parity, and I ask that you folks consider in your hearts if you don't really think that the American agriculture is worth of ninety percent of parity, if you think that we should go down and supply all the needs of the world, if we should go into a debt and find out that our interest is a hundred and thirteen percent, a hundred and twenty percent...my friends all I ask you is to support this amendment and you will find out that we have sent the best advice to the Congress and the Department of Agriculture that has ever been asked to be sent back there.

PRESIDENT: The question is...the motion before the House is the adoption of the Keyes' amendment to LR 183. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on the Keyes' amendment to LR 183. Have you all voted? Senator Keyes, it is coming very slowly here, what do you wish to do?

SENATOR KEYES: How many are excused today?

PRESIDENT: Five right now.

SENATOR KEYES: Five. We have still got enough. I am going to ask for a Call of the House and roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: All right. Okay, pull those off the board, and all those in favor of a Call of the House vote aye, opposed nay. Motion is, shall the House go under Call? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 6 ayes, 17 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. Give us the vote on the motion.

CLERK: On the original motion, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: On the original motion.

CLERK: It was 11 ayes, 21 nays on the motion to adopt Senator Keyes' amendment.
