SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried. Amendment is adopted. Now, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is offered by Senator Cullan and it was on page 1999 of the Legislative Journal from last year.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, I would ask unanimous consent to withdraw that amendment or any other amendment that I have pending with the exception of the kill motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is there any objection? So ordered. Next one, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Venditte has a motion to suspend Rule 6, Section 4 and Rule 7, Section 3 and vote to advance LB 382.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Legislature will be at ease for a couple of minutes. Senator Venditte. The Legislature will come back to order. Go ahead.
