I'm not against tying the can on the bear's tail but I think that we are probably having a test in futility this morning in trying to get at them this way. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Haberman speaking to the Barrett amendment.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Kahle, thank you very much for bringing the Regents into this. As you...whether you missed it or not the Regents said that we should be aloof on this issue, that the Regents should not be involved in politics. Well I say that if the Regents maybe weren't so aloof, the university might not have all of the problems that it does have. The firm is in Wisconsin that ordered these tests and they are working with the Russians, they are representing the Russians on these tests. The tests have been completed. It is a written report that they really want. That is what my Resolution says, that we should sit on it. So I do support Senator Barrett's amendment.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion on the Barrett amendment, and lets keep our remarks to the Barrett amendment if we can. Seeing none, Senator Barrett, you may close on your amendment.

SENATOR BARRETT: Very simply a repeat, the last seven words of Section 2, page 202 of the Journal appear to me to be in violation of our State and Federal Constitution. I don't believe that we can confiscate the property of another nation under the 14th amendment due process. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Motion is the adoption of the Barrett amendment to LR 184. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, one nay on the adoption of Senator Barrett's motion.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The Barrett amendment is adopted. We now return to discussion on LR 184. Chair recognizes Senator Nichol.
