

we probably ought to under those circumstances dispose of the committee amendments one way or another. We could, if that is what is going to happen we could, and really this is the place it ought to be done, not accept the committee amendments. A motion to reject the committee amendments would be in order.

SENATOR NICHOL: In that case I move for the adoption of the committee amendments and urge the members of the Legislature to vote against the adoption of the committee amendments thereby nullifying them and turning the situation over to Senator DeCamp. I move for the adoption of the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: That would have the same effect as rejecting them. Senator DeCamp, do you wish to...all right, the motion then is the, do you understand the motion is to adopt them but he is recommending that they not be adopted. All those in favor of adopting the committee amendments on LB 222 vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: No ayes, 25 nays on the motion to adopt committee amendments, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: All right, the committee amendments were rejected and we will then proceed with, are the amendments on the desk? All right there are some other amendments on the desk. Senator DeCamp, do you have a position that your amendments should come first, or would you care to pick them up in order.

SENATOR DE CAMP: I would hope that we could take up these other amendments first because they are a complete bill. They come from the county attorneys, the Attorney General, the Medical Association, county sheriffs, various other groups that worked for the last nine months putting it together.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp, as I understand it, you are chairman of this special committee and these are in effect the amendments of that committee anyway so they should take precedence at this point. Isn't that right?

SENATOR DE CAMP: Yes, why not.

PRESIDENT: For the record.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Sure.

PRESIDENT: We will proceed then taking up the amendments as proposed by Senator DeCamp. Mr. Clerk, read the amendments.
