SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: I would move for the rejection of the committee amendments. This bill is kind of screwed up the way it is. We are going to have another amendment for it pretty quick but this bill is no good the way it is and I would vote to get rid of the committee amendments. I move to reject the committee amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to reject the committee amendments to LB 203. Is there any discussion? All those in favor of Senator Clark's motion vote aye. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I would just be interested in hearing an explanation of why the committee amendments are being rejected.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Wesely has another amendment to 426 and he is right behind you and he will show you that amendment. What we were doing here was taking the original 913 and revising 913 and then killing the whole thing is what it amounted to. So what he is doing right now, what he will do when we reject these amendments, we will take 426 and revise that statute and also delete 913 which are identical statutes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Any other discussion? Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I would just like to echo Senator Clark's remarks. We went over this bill quite a bit and the feeling is that the committee amendments which are now before us would not, in fact, deal with the problem that the bill is intending to address and so I would urge your rejection and then I have got an amendment which was distributed a couple of minutes ago which will I think better address the problem and I think we can discuss it at that time.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to reject the committee amendments to LB 203. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to reject the committee amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the committee amendments are rejected. Now do we have some other amendments?
