SENATOR STONEY: Thank you.

SENATOR WESELY: Oh, Senator Goodrich just advised me, Senator Stoney, that they are in the, what was that, the Railroad Safety Act, so evidently the language is already included in that. Sorry, I didn't know that information.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to advance LB 203 to... Okay, the motion is the adoption of the Wesely amendment. Is there any further discussion? All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. We are voting on the Wesely amendment to LB 203. Have you all voted? We are voting on the Wesely amendments to LB 203. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 2 nays on the motion to adopt, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The amendments are adopted. Now, Senator Wesely, do you want to move the bill?

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, I move the advancement of the bill to Select File with one note that there are some questions from Senator Vickers and Senator Beutler that I would look into and try and clear up on Select File. I think that is the time to deal with it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to advance the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. Is Senator Hoagland in the room? Is Senator Hoagland in the environs?

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Hoagland, 261. The Clerk will read please.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 261 was introduced by Senator Peter Hoagland. (Title read.) The bill was read January 15 last year. It was referred to the Constitutional Committee. It was advanced to General File. The body adopted the committee amendments on January 11 of this year. At that time the bill failed to advance, Mr. President.
