LB 108

SENATOR DE CAMP: I will withdraw them, Mr. President. They are good amendments but the bill has had some changes since then. I will just not take them up now.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Hearing no objections, so ordered.

SENATOR DE CAMP: They correct other areas of law on administrative procedures, basically. I will use another bill for it. It is not controversial.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Landis then moves to indefinitely postpone LB 108. Pursuant to our rules that would lay the bill over a day.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want to make a motion to suspend the rules to take the bill up?

SENATOR LANDIS: Yes, I move to suspend the rules to take the bill up today. It is not my purpose to delay the bill. It is simply my purpose to discuss the bill in length so I have no qualms about debating it and voting on the bill today.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to suspend the rules and take up LB 108 today. There is a kill motion. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. We need thirty. The motion is to suspend the rules to take up LB 108 and the suspension of the rules was posed because there is a kill motion on the bill. Have you all voted? Have you all voted on the motion to suspend the rules so we can take up LB 108? Record the vote.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 1 nay to suspend the rules so as to take up the kill motion, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Landis on his motion to kill LB 108.

SENATOR LANDIS: Members of the Legislature, Mr. Speaker, I would like to talk today about LB 108, a bill with a checkered and perhaps tortured career so far, a committee bill introduced by the Business and Labor Committee, a bill which did not make the first round on General File and only through exceptional ardor made it through the second attempt on General File and stalled again on Select File and now is up for its second vote on Select File. I would like to talk about LB 108 because I am not sure the membership can recall easily the rather intricate past of what this bill is about from last year. This is a measure which requires that all
