PRESIDENT: Did you withdraw that. Okay, the amendment is withdrawn. We are now back on the Fitzgerald amendment. Is there any further discussion on the Fitzgerald amendment? If not, Senator Fitzgerald do you want to close? Senator Lewis. Senator Lewis. I'm trying to find out. All right Senator Fitzgerald will you please close.

SENATOR FITZGERALD: To save time I will have no closing. I think we should just vote on it because it is a necessity.

PRESIDENT: That will be fine. All those in favor of adopting the Fitzgerald amendment, LB 184 vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 31 ayes, no nays on the adoption of Senator Fitzgerald's amendment, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries, the Fitzgerald amendment to LB 184 is adopted. Now we have another amendment. Read the amendment Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Read Wesely amendment as it appears on page 279 of the Legislative Journal.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Wesely and I would ask that all of you who have had your lights on, some of you turn your lights on and you leave them on and I have no idea as to who wants to talk now on the various amendments. Senator Newell do you wish to speak on this one after Senator Wesely?

SENATOR NEWELL: I have a procedural question that I need to bring up. It is not relative to...
