LB 123, 490, 572.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I had a kill motion on this bill, Mr. Speaker, because the provisions of this bill were included in a bill introduced by Senator Landis which passed the last session. There is no need for this bill and I would move at this time that we vote to kill it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Any further discussion? It is a motion to kill, right? All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. The motion is to indefinitely postpone LB 490. Have you all voted? 490. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to indefinitely postpone.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Hefner, are you prepared to take up 123?

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. Speaker, I ask unanimous consent to lay this bill over.

SPEAKER MARVEL: You want it passed over.

SENATOR HEFNER: Yes, passed over.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Where is Senator Nichol? Is Senator Nichol or some other member of Judiciary in the room so we could take up 572? Senator Stoney.

CLERK: Mr. President...

SPEAKER MARVEL: You want to read it?

CLERK: Yes, sir. LB 572 was introduced by the Judiciary Committee and signed by the members thereof. (Read title.) The bill was first read on February 12 of last year. It was referred to the Judiciary Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. Mr. President, it was considered by the body on April 11th of last year.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, LB 572 was introduced by the Judiciary Committee at the request of the State Treasurer's office. The purpose of LB 572 is to eliminate a conflict with the Unclaimed Property Act, section 69-1301 to 69-1329. LB 572 would require that certain monies held by the clerks of the district courts be paid to the State Treasurer for eventual deposit in the permanent
