

history in Nebraska that we have to live with. We have certain physical limitations we have to live with, and to try to by statute make an overnight adjustment of this I think it is impossible and we could be creating greater problems than we are solving. I know Senator Schmit had spent a lot of time, or some time in Texas, looking at that particular system and has brought back a lot of positive suggestions on that. The essence of these amendments are to give the administration and management of our present industries the flexibility to do what is best under the circumstances that they must operate within for the state of Nebraska. So I would urge the adoption of these amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Schmit, do you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, just very briefly. I have no objections to the amendment offered by Senator Dworak. We discussed it. We had originally intended to offer some similar language on Select File but as far as I am concerned I believe this is a fine place to take it and let's just go ahead and adopt the amendment. I support the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Fowler. Okay, Senator Johnson, do you wish to speak to the Dworak amendment?

SENATOR JOHNSON: Yes, I do, Mr. Speaker. I have a question of Senator Dworak if he would yield, if he is around. The question is this, Senator Dworak, your amendment I take it starts at page 9 of the bill and cuts out subsection 1 of Section 7, subsection 2 of Section 7, subsection 3 of Section 7. Is that where it stops?

SENATOR DWORAK: That is correct, and then one word change on line 15 of page 10...

SENATOR JOHNSON: Okay.

SENATOR DWORAK: ...subsection 5, where it says ten percent, it strikes ten percent and put in an amount...

SENATOR JOHNSON: I see.

SENATOR DWORAK: ...to get away from an arbitrary term.

SENATOR JOHNSON: All right. I appreciate that answer. I have only a couple of comments to make about Senator Dworak's amendment. In the first place, I think his amendment is a very wise and good amendment. In the second place, it doesn't
