be put out for any reason. Perhaps that might be a little tighter as far as I am personally concerned but the bill is certainly a lot better than it was to start with and I am sure ~~you and everybody~~ else knows that. I don't know if that answers your questions. If not, then proceed.

SENATOR NEWELL: Let me ask this, let me just address the one part. Right now a mother cannot have the records opened unless she agrees that they be opened. The natural mother cannot and neither can the natural child so they have a veto power in that process. So I think that is about as tight as we can get it. I guess the real question I have to ask is, do you feel that there is a need, or let me ask it more basically, do you want to have....

SPEAKER MARVEL: You have about fifteen seconds.

SENATOR NEWELL: Would you be willing to have...I guess, want to have, do you feel there is need to have public hearing on this, another public hearing?

SENATOR NICHOL: I personally don't feel that there is but we will have one if you want one and bring in more people to clarify it further if you like. I personally don't feel we need one and I could vote one way or the other depending on if it is made a little bit tighter for that mother on Select File I could go with it but, as committee chairman, we will be glad to have your hearing if you want.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, time is up. Senator Venditte, do you wish to close on your motion?

SENATOR VENDITTE: Yes, very brief, Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I can understand, you know, the quickness that we would like our pieces of legislation to be rushed across the Board. You know this is not the first time, Senator Newell, that I have heard this before, you know, let's let it go to Select File. We will take care of any of the problems that we think we might encounter later on down the road on Select File. Well, Senator Newell, if this did go back to committee hearing and let's say the committee hearing was set for sometime in February, this bill could become law by late spring or early summer and we are just giving the people a chance, we are just simply giving the people a chance to respond on a piece of legislation that has been altered to the point where it has become a new bill.
