SPEAKER MARVEL: Time is up. Senator Dworak, do you wish to speak to the motion?

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President and colleagues, Senator Kelly specifically, Senator Kelly, I think that Senator Hoagland has taken some heat here from various members and he is really kind of a good guy in this situation. I drew up this amendment, Senator Kelly, two years ago and I talked to you about this amendment and I had it in hand, and Senator Hoagland joined me and it was Senator Hoagland that determined that we had struck this grandfather clause, and so he brought this to light with this amendment and he called my attention to this amendment, and he asked me to mention this in my closing. In the emotion and fervor that I got myself subjected to in the closing, I had forgotten to mention it. I will support 221 with this amendment. There are some people on this floor playing games with this amendment, Senator Kelly, and with the amendment that we previously had adopted. I think 221 is a good bill now. I think we do need this amendment which was the intent to have it in there, but through the bill drafter and myself it got inadvertently put out.
