

Hoagland amendment. Mr. Clerk, is it there?

CLERK: It is a motion by Senators Dworak, Hoagland and Wagner. In the Hoagland amendments previously adopted on page 282 of the Journal on page 1 strike beginning with the semicolon in line 5 through the number "26" in line 6.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion before the House is the second Hoagland amendment as read by the Clerk. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 11 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The amendment is adopted. What is the next order of business?

CLERK: Mr. President, the last amendment is the one previously offered by Senator DeCamp found on page 122 of the Legislative Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this amendment is super, super simple. It has no grandfather clauses. It has no on-off anything else. It just says, 20 years of age is the drinking age instead of 19. It would make the law identical to what it is now, except that the age would now be 20. I ask unanimous consent at the request of Senator Kelly to withdraw the amendment at this time, let you think about it between now and Select File and maybe we will or won't take it up depending upon what you discover about this bill between now and the next time you play with it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: You have heard the motion. If there is no objections, so ordered.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to advance 221 to E & R for Review. Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I respectfully renew my motion to advance LB 221 to E & R Initial.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Chambers, your light is still on, do you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, because I didn't complete what I
