LB 497

Mr. Chairman, to pass over the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: We can pass over it and put it in that special category and then you can bring it up again.

SENATOR KREMER: Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. Senator Lamb, do you want to take up the next bill, 497?

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 497 was introduced by the Ag Committee. (Read title to LB 497.) The bill was referred to the Ag Committee. It was advanced to General File with amendments. I do have a motion to indefinitely postpone by Senator Schmit.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, this is a bill that deals with the litter problem which was advanced from the Agriculture Committee last year before LB 120 was advanced and then finally passed, and in view of the fact that LB 120 is now in effect, this bill no longer serves any good purpose, and so Senator Schmit and the members of the Agriculture Committee recommend that this bill be killed.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Schmit, do you wish to comment on 497?

SENATOR SCHMIT: I just concur with what Senator Lamb has said. The bill had its run last session. LB 120 was passed. There are problems with 120. I understand Senator DeCamp has some amendments for that in another bill and I don't believe in trying to breathe life into a dead horse so I ask that the bill be killed and I hope some of my good urban friends will give me a vote of confidence on this bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp, do you wish to speak to the motion?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Well, if they don't want me to use the bill obviously I won't do it, but...well, I guess I won't.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to indefinitely postpone LB 497 under item 7, General File. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. We're voting on a motion to indefinitely postpone 497. Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The next bill is LB 304.
