on this particular bill right now, that we lay it over because of the fact that it has come to our attention the City of Lincoln has some amendments that they would like to attach to this bill, and I am going to suggest that we pass this over so that we can then take up those amendments that the City of Lincoln wants, and consider those before we advance the bill any further. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the bill is passed over. Is Senator DeCamp in the room? The next bill is 496 which is a Banking bill. Do you want to...are you having a meeting right over here? You are going to. Okay. Why don't you read the bill then...read the title.

CLERK: LB 496 was a bill introduced by the Banking, Commerce and Insurance Committee and signed by the members thereof. (Read title to LB 496.) The bill was read on January 17, 1979. It was referred to the Banking Committee for public hearing. Mr. President, the bill was advanced to General File. I have amendments pending by Senator DeCamp that are found on page 265 of the Legislative Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Pass over the 496?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes, Mr. President. The Banking Department has a new set of amendments. Since the bill was first introduced there have been major developments. Senator Vickers knows about it well. This bill involves the oil and gas industry and the resolution of a number of those problems has occurred already through the Governor's office, through Senator Vickers, through others, and would like to use the bill to correct some other areas in the securities loss, and the Banking Department has those amendments up there but they have to have some contact with individual members so I would ask to pass over it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you have any comments while you are here on 481?

SENATOR DeCAMP: We will do that, if you want.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Pardon.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes, we can...I can take that one up.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want to take it up now?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes, why not.
