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the same way by popular contribution and believe me, it has done a great deal of good. Before this any services were held in dark, dingy rooms, gym, any place they could meet. These are nice surroundings. It is used. That I want to emphasize. It is a good idea.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? Seeing none, Senator Sieck, I guess you may close on your resolution.

SENATOR SIECK: I will close with urging you to support this because I do feel it is a much needed practice at the chapel. Where they now hold the services at the institution they also hold discipline sessions so they don't hardly connect and they could also use this chapel as a counselling service to the individuals who are there. It would be a great help to the prisoners or to the inmates that are held at this institution. Thank you. I urge your support.

PRESIDENT: The motion before the House then is the adoption of the Sieck, et al, resolution 187. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the resolution, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. LR 187 is adopted. Mr. Clerk, is there a motion on the desk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Haberman moves to suspend Rule 3, Section 5 so as to cancel the public hearing scheduled for LB 661 this coming Wednesday.

PRESIDENT: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, this bill is a very important bill. I have an Attorney General's opinion that I am waiting on that will affect the outcome of the bill. I have talked to the chairman of the Revenue Committee and he says that they can use this time that they have scheduled for other important matters. I quite frankly, am not prepared. I do not have all of my information as some of the people that are involved in this have been rather slow in furnishing me information. Therefore, I would graciously ask that the body support and give me the 30 votes to suspend the rules so that we can change the hearing. Thank you, Mr. President.
